The detailed review conducted by the Chief Electoral Officer may result in adjustments for a number of reasons including omission of expenses that must be reported as election expenses and inclusion of expenses that do not meet the definition of election expenses.

2 The spending limits and reimbursable amounts are based on the greater of either the number of electors on the preliminary list or the final list.
