


The write-in ballot is designed to ensure the secrecy of your vote. As an additional measure to safeguard privacy, all the ballot envelopes are mixed before being opened and counted.


Step 1.

Print the name of the candidate for whom you are voting in the box at the top of the ballot. If the candidate is running for a party you may also place an "X" in the circle of the candidate's party.



Step 2.

Place your marked ballot into the ballot envelope and seal it.



Step 3.

Place the sealed ballot envelope in the declaration envelope and seal it.


How to Complete your Write-in Ballot

Step 4.

Complete part 1 of the Declaration envelope.

If this is not completed, your vote will not count.



Step 5.

Place the completed Declaration envelope (containing the sealed ballot envelope) into the return envelope.

Step 6.

Return your write-in ballot to the address shown on the return envelope before 8:00 pm on election day. Your ballot will not count if it arrives after that time. If you are mailing your ballot, make sure that you have adequate postage on the envelope.

Remember, it is your responsibility to ensure your write-in ballot is received before polls close at 8:00 pm on election day.

Who can vote?

You are eligible to vote in a Nova Scotia election if you are:

- a Canadian citizen
- 18 years of age or older on election day
- have lived in Nova Scotia
 6 months or more before
 the day the writ is issued
